This December The Friendship Circle held it's 2nd Annual FC Wraps Toy Drive. #### **New: Mitzvah Volunteer Program**

On January 9, 2012 we will launch The FC Bnai Mitzvah Volunteer Program (MVP). MVP will allow 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> grade children to experience volunteering at a young age in a meaningful hands-on way. To be a volunteer with FC is a serious, year-long commitment. A typical FC teen volunteer devotes many hours each month. Since younger children are generally unable to make this commitment,

MVP will provide these children with a meaningful way of empowering themselves as they give to others. MVP will be a series of 5 sessions, offered twice each year. Through lectures, video presentations, and hands-on volunteering, participants will get a closer look at the lives of children with special needs as well as an educated exposure to volunteering with special children.

#### **New: Teen Scene**

Starting January 17, 2012 our extraordinary Teen Scene program will give teenagers with special needs, together with our teen volunteers, an opportunity to practice life skills, pursue their own interests, and hang out with friends their own age. Teen Scene is a new program providing teenagers with special needs an opportunity to do what typical teens do: hang out and have fun!

This unique program gives special needs teenagers the ability to act and interact in a regular social setting like other typical teens. Together, under the supervision and guidance of our trained therapists, the teens will engage in exciting adventures, such as spending the day at the Science Center, taking a trip to the Air and Space Museum, or bowling a few lanes!

#### Volunteer Spotlights: Binny Greene & Esther Goldberg



Binny and Esther are both in their first year volunteering with the Friendship Circle. Binny, a senior at Northwest Yeshiva High School, and Esther, an 8th grader at Seattle Hebrew Academy have each come to FC at different times in their lives, but are both dedicated, motivated, and can always be counted on to be good role models for their buddies.

When we asked about why they chose to get involved with FC, Binny responded that "since I entered high school my friends have been telling me that Friendship circle is a fun and fulfilling program." For Esther, "I got involved in Friendship Circle mostly because my sister did it for many years and I thought it would be really beneficial for me. She really inspired me with how often she went and how dedicated she was to Friendship Circle."

For Binny, "my favorite thing about Friendship circle would definitely be the people. Everybody always seems happy to be there. [At Friendship Circle] I have learned how to work with the different types of kids. I love hanging out with my buddy, he is a good kid and really good at chess. My buddy is really easy to be with, and just talking to him and taking an interest in his life seems to make an impact. Friendship Circle is a giving, fun, and awesome organization."

For Esther, "my favorite thing about Friendship Circle is really the look on the child's face when they forget everything except the fun they

are having with you and they don't feel different, just special. The feeling you get afterwards is also really rewarding, that you really helped someone, made a difference. I have learned the idea that I can really make a change and that I am really making a difference in these kids' lives is very moving to me. As a thirteen year old girl, there's not much I can participate in to really change things but Friendship Circle gives me the chance, and has taught me how to do that."
